

## **MSC School Leadership Team FAQs**

What is the SLT? The School Leadership Team (SLT) is a joint team of teachers, parents, school staff, and the Principal that is mandated by the Chancellor's Regulation A-655, so *all public schools have an SLT*. The SLT plays a significant role in creating a structure for school-based decision making around educational policies and shaping the path to a collaborative school culture. The SLT contributes to the development of the Comprehensive Educational Plan (CEP) and assists in the evaluation of the CEP.

SLT members can solicit input from various constituencies in order to ensure that all voices are heard regarding the needs of students. *The SLT is not involved in the day-to-day operations of the school; rather, they* collaborate on issues related to the school's education plan.

Who is on the SLT? MSC's School Leadership Team (SLT) is comprised of 10 members of the school community: 4 teachers (including the UFT chapter leader); 4 parents (elected to represent K-2, 3-5, 6-8, and one at-large); the school principal and the PTA co-presidents (representing a single voting member)

SLT elections (for parent seats) are held each spring to coincide with Parent Association (PA) elections. Any parent with a child enrolled in K-7<sup>th</sup> grade can run for the SLT.

Can I observe the meetings? Meetings are able to be observed by any member of the MSC community (parents, teachers, staff) but only elected SLT members can participate and vote on SLT issues. According to the bylaws of the SLT, non-members cannot participate or speak during the meeting unless recognized by the Chair prior to speaking. Non-members that wish to raise an item to the SLT should bring the issue description to a team member first (eg, their constituent representative) who can request that it be added to a future agenda.
